
President Ron Steinke conducted the meeting. General Manager/CEO David Dunning and President Ron Steinke gave a joint presentation to the members.

Get the Most From Your WiFi Four Ways to Improve Your Internet

Polar is offering lightning fast broadband Internet speeds, but if your WiFi router is out of date or not set up correctly, your service may not be as fast as it could be. Here are some tips to help improve your Internet service.

1. Choose the right channel and frequency. Routers have numerous channels. Sometimes just changing the channel can make a big difference. Channel 6 is the default of most routers, so we would advise against using it. You run the highest risk of it being congested, especially in apartments and condos. A better choice would be choosing a channel closer to 1 or closer to 11. Routers also have different frequencies. Generally speaking 2.4 GHz is better for bigger homes with multiple floors because the signal travels farther and through walls. For smaller rooms or homes, 5 GHz is great because it offers faster speed, just at a shorter range.

2. Move your router to its ideal position. Keep your router centrally located and away from water, windows, and thick walls made of brick or concrete. Another option is to install a wireless access point in the locations which have issues. A wireless access point will "boost" or "repeat" the signal in the areas in which it is installed. Installation involves running an Ethernet cable from your router to the location of the access point. Once connected, traffic will run from the router, through the Ethernet cable, and be broadcast wirelessly from the new access point.

3. Make sure your router is secure. Protecting your router with a password or limiting which devices can access your network will keep other people from using it and slowing it down.

4. Update your router. It may surprise you the number of devices in your home that are accessing your network. Things like computers, phones, tablets, gaming consoles, and smart TVs can easily exceed your router's capacity if used simultaneously. A router is essentially the brain of your network, as everything runs through it. A high WiFi signal is not an indicator of high WiFi speed. Issues can arise if your router cannot handle the amount of traffic passing through it.
